Meeting called to order: 7:05 p.m.

Student Leadership Report:

- The new student lunch for all students new to the school is organized with a pizza lunch in the Foods Room
- The Open House is planned for September 19th for parents to tour the school with parents; there is a BBQ hosted by Leadership
- The 21st Terry Fox run is taking place on September 21st; we are doing Toonies for Terry; the class who raises the most funds gets a pizza lunch
- National Indigenous Peoples Day is on September 29th; orange shirts and bracelets will be sold by donation (Suggested: \$10 for a shirt \$1 for a bracelet), as well as a "guess the number in a candy jar", with funds going to the Rebuild Acqant Nation to help with fire recovery; the Nation will be offering food stuffs to help raise funds; there will be a school assembly at a later date to present the funds.

Approval of June 6, 2023 minutes:

Minutes were not available; to be approved at the October meeting.

Treasurer's Report:

• We received bank statements finally

Balances are:

General: \$1,588.75; no cheques outstanding

Gaming: \$17,201.22

Budgeted items: we are waiting on two to three scholarships to come out

Principal's Report:

- Discussions were about the importance of keeping up PAC meeting attendance with many new parents in attendance; these meetings are a good place to learn what is going on in the school, how the school is tracking results and any changes in education and reporting on student achievements etc
- The school used to rely on parent volunteers for activities like the Open House BBQ but now the Leadership classes plan and run these types of activities and events
- A thank you to parents for their patience while the school gets the new payment (Cash Online) and forms system (Clevr) up and running fully
- International students can use the system to pay their fees as well
- Preparations to plan this year's Grad Ceremonies and Prom are underway;
 Michelle will be meeting with Grade 12s; there will be two major fundraisers
 coming up with one this year and one after the Christmas break; will be setting
 up a grad council; there will be grad photos the week after we return from the
 break where parents can setup a 30-minute session for photos with cap and
 gown and props.
- Staff updates: Jeff Bates is on leave; Jenny Healey is filling in for him; Jeff Pew is back; Scott Sharun is now at McKim; Brad Carriere is now VP at Selkirk; Lindsay Gunn is covering Senior Math and some Junior Math and Science classes.
- Enrollment numbers are showing quite a few students attending part-time or online and more part-time senior students than in past years; estimates are that we have 540 students attending in person.
- International student numbers are 27-28 students, but could take 28-30 students now, as two are here staying with family; this is up from last year, but still lower than in past years; challenge is finding Homestays; International students bring a lot of funds into the school and are what enables the school to offer more specialized classes like outdoor education.
- Homestays can take up to two students and must provide a bedroom for each and a private bathroom; students are from Grade 8 to 12 and can come for 3, 5 or 10 month stints; those who have hosted International students have reported what a great experience it is.
- The Selkirk goal for the year is "success for all learners"; literacy and numeracy
 assessment results will be the main focus; the school saw some growth in
 literacy with an 80%+ proficiency; numeracy is growing but still lower; school is
 working on teaching how to apply numeracy knowledge to problem solve using
 technology to become better critical thinkers and are embedding this type of
 thinking in other non-numeracy classes.
- Another goal is around equity, diversity and inclusion; increasing the sense of belonging in the school; focus of our Leadership classes is to be examples of generosity and showing how small acts can make a difference; students are involved in mentorship and tutoring; the school needs to work on racial equity
- Teachers are continuing to collaborate this year with teachers attending each others classes to gain further skills and provide constructive feedback.

- The school is still continuing to work on the Values Mission, and on the match between what the school is doing and how it is being received; key areas are: respect, innovation, equity, and growth.
- BC has a new reporting order with 8-9 grades based on a proficiency scale rather than a work habits piece; more work is needed to assess for things like Honour Roll; Grade 8-9 will be doing goal setting a self reflection exercises 3 times per year with a final grade reported at the end of the school year;
- Grade 10-12 still receive a percentage mark and work habits rating
- September 20th is photo day; reminder: no hats, sunglasses, or attire with wording or imagery not fitting the school dress code should be worn.
- This year the PAC will no longer be able to offer scholarships due to gaming rules for the grant money provided; the community is a huge supporter of our grads and offer a large number and variety of scholarships that grads can apply for.

DPAC Report (Coralie Hockly):

• There is currently no news; DPAC will have their AGM in October/November; it is strongly suggested that we have a representative on this body.

• PAC received thank you cards and photos from last year's scholarship recipients.

Old Business:

New Business:

- It is recommended we purchase of a BCCPAC membership for the 2023/2024 school year as a PAC; cost is \$75 for the year; cost to be presented with this year's budget
